



Anglicans in the European Institutions 2021 Internship

Are you a current student or recent graduate with a deep interest in politics and policy making in the European Institutions? Would you like to gain experience of how Anglican representation to the EU and Council of Europe is contributing to the faith agenda? Are you a committed Christian, with a passion for advocacy?

The Office of the Anglican Bishop in Europe, with the support of the Archbishop of Canterbury's Anglican Communion Fund, is offering a **2021 internship**. The current key areas of focus for our advocacy work in the European Institutions are:

- Refugees & migration
- Gender Justice
- Freedom of religion and belief
- Human rights
- Climate change and environmental degradation

As our successful Anglicans in European Institutions (ANGLES) intern, you will offer some background from your academic studies and/or possibly related experience, in at least **one** of the above areas. You will be a fluent communicator in English (oral and written), and proficiency in French would be an advantage. You will have excellent research and analytical skills, well-developed people skills to engage and work with a range of stakeholders, and proven ability to meet deadlines. Your focus will be on policy research and engagement to support Anglican stakeholder relationships with our ecumenical partners in Churches across Europe, and achieve Anglican aims in engaging with the European Institutions, notably as we develop our advocacy for the EU's Future of Europe Conference, and the Council of Europe's policy agenda.

This internship has a living costs allowance for its one-month duration of **1230 EUR**. The period of the internship is anticipated during September 2021, by arrangement with the Bishop's Attaché to the European Institutions. The place of work for the internship, and opportunity to work in our central Brussels Office, will be dependent on the overall Covid-19 situation.
