



A course to help you develop and build upon your faith.

# Who is it for?

It is open to everyone and is free of charge for all. You may choose to follow this simply to enrich your own discipleship, or as a foundation for further study to become a Reader, for example.

Some of the units will take you deeper into themes you looked at in confirmation preparation or an Alpha course (for example). In other units you will encounter new issues and challenges.

### How does it work?

It is designed to be completed in one year. We meet fortnightly for 90 minute workshops and there is some personal study outside of these. Students can also submit four assignments to qualify for the Bishop's Certificate.

Chaplaincies can run the course locally, and there is also an online option open to everyone across our diocese.

## **Knowing God**

Exploring prayer, taking the Lord's Prayer as our model for Christian prayer.

### **Growing in Christ**

Learning more about who Jesus was, and what he did, how these core Christian teachings developed, and their implications for us.

### **Building Community**

Discovering how our faith in Jesus Christ must lead us to explore the nature of Christian community and the corporate life of the Church.

#### Living beyond ourselves

We explore the necessity for individual Christians and church communities to engage with the wider church and world, taking account of issues such as ecumenism, our responsibility for creation, and questions of justice and human dignity.
