Future youth intern scheme

This is a development on the MES. A young person, who has an interest in children and youth ministry is placed in a chaplaincy for 9 months to work alongside those who lead children and youth ministry. As well as learning on the job, they also have access to National Training in youth ministry. There are some commitments and costs for the chaplaincy but not exorbitant.
