### A FEW HINTS AND TIPS

#### To record the film:

- Selfie mode is fine if you would like to record yourself!
- If you are able to show your location in the background in some way something recognisable about your chaplaincy (we have some lovely shots from last Easter filmed on the beach, or up a mountain for example), that's great. This really helps to show off the vibrancy and differences across our diocese.
- Say it nice and slowly!

Obviously you can hold the words up if you need to, if you are feeling tech-savvy, you can use an app like one of these as a teleprompter if that helps:

• Parrot: Android iOS

Teleprompter: <u>Android</u> <u>iOS</u>

#### To send the film:

- We Transfer is good
- If filmed on your phone and not too big a file size, WhatsApp is fine
- By email as an attachment is fine if it will go
- Please don't forget to say who you are and where you are from

## **Couple of filming tips:**

- Try not to film straight into the light as we won't be able to see you
- Sound is really important, so try to film somewhere relatively quiet if possible
- You can hold your device whichever way is easiest for you
- Don't forget to ensure people in the video have agreed to be filmed, your chaplaincy should have some guidance.

# **The Nicene Creed**

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come.
